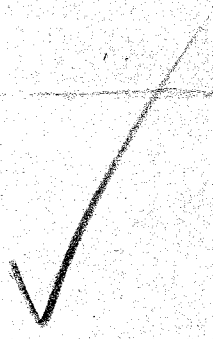

CANOE TRIP # 11

We left Rochester, Minnesota at 5 o'clock Tuesday, Aug. 10 and arrived at the base at 4 o'clock. When supper was over and we had checked out our equipment, camp was set up for the nite.

The next morning at 8:30 A.M. we started out on the real trip. Our first portage was "Prairie Portage" which wasn't tough at all. We next stopped at the Canadian Ranger Station where we got our fishing licenses. We ate lunch on portage between Sunday and Burke Lakes.

The toughest portage we went over was the "Meadows Portage". We ate supper along Lake Agnes by "Louisa Falls Portage". Swimming in Louisa Falls "bath tub" was a lot of fun. After supper we portaged up the falls and into Lake Louisa. That nite we paddled in the moon-light. At 10 o'clock that nite we made camp at the upper end of the lake. After two nites there we paddled down Louisa against a strong headwind. After portaging again we paddled up Agnes and made camp in the "narrows". Here was one of the best "pike" spots we hit.

Next morning we turned off on the "Silence Cut-off" which took us along a small lakes chain with a lot of small portages. That nite we camped on Summer Lake. We caught a lot of "Nothens" there (one that ~~was~~ ~~gave~~ weighed 15 lbs.)

From Summer we came down through North Bay and stayed on the end of it that nite. There was a storm that nite and we were glad we had a camp site back in the woods.

The next day we had our sails full of wind the whole way to the base. We had two long portages that last day from Wind Bay to Wind Lake and from Wind Lake to Moose Lake where the base is located.

Our guide's name was Ed Woolerton and he was a swell guy.

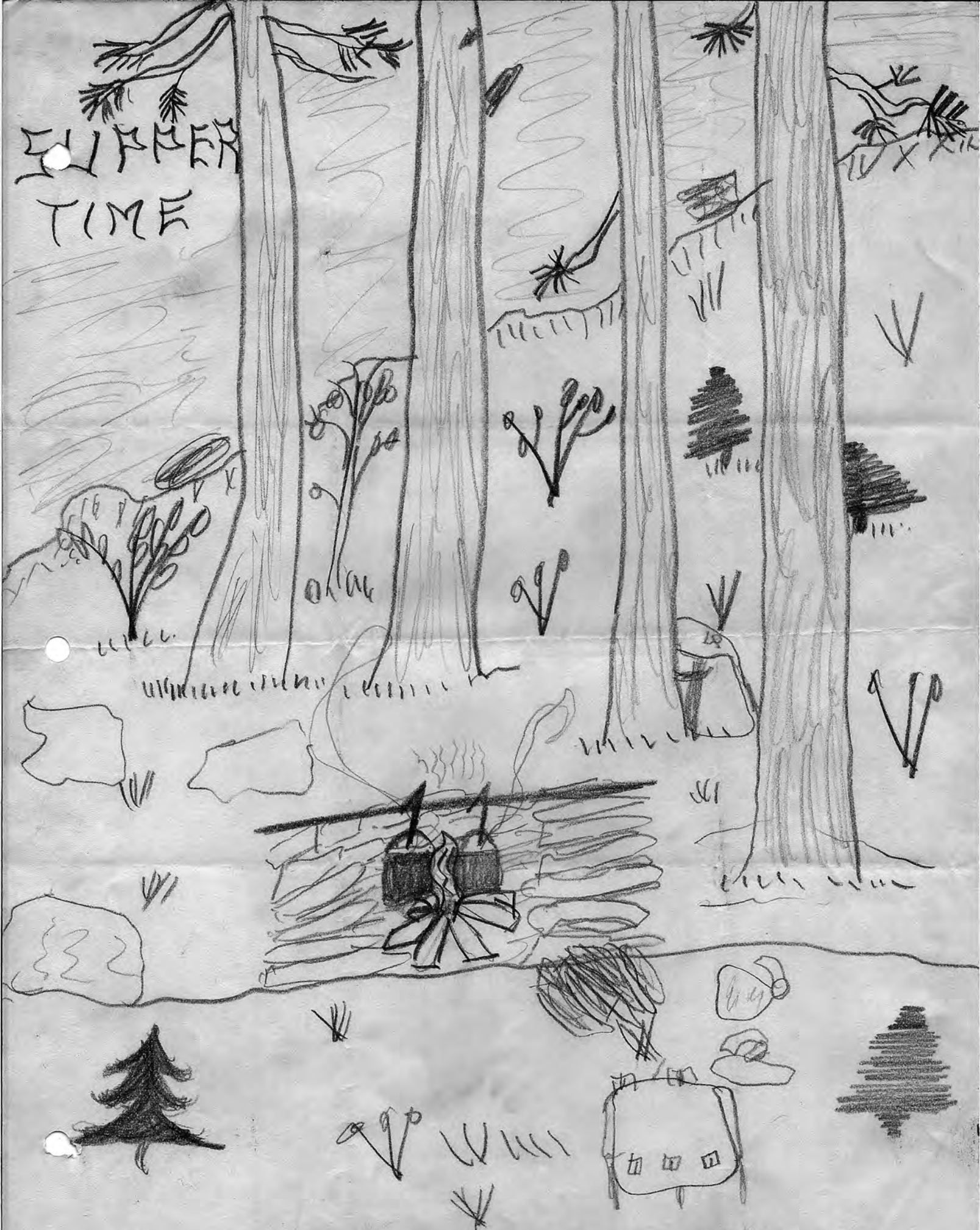
