Sunday July 12

Arrived at canoe base & met instructor and other scouts. Received equipment and paddled to Island in Moose Lake. Light rain during evening.

Monday July 13

Paddled through high waves in Bagley Bay. Registered at Canadian Ranger Station. Camped at Louisa Falls. Guide showed us how to steak fish.

Tuesday July 14

Went over first difficult passages. Did not vacuum fan. I worked on Bronze Paddle upward. Did some fishing, camped on Tanguier Lake.

Wednesday July 15

We made good time today. We paddled over places that were supposed to be portages. It must be more water than usual. I paddled alone in them in McEwen Lake while bow man looked for waterfowl. Camped on wet lake by a waterfall. Good fishing.

Thursday July 16

Went through many small lake & land portages today. Camped on a island in the The Ottemans Lake. I passed part of canoeing merit badge.

Threatened by rain but had none.



Friday July 17.

Finished conveying Munt Bodge this morning. Hottest day we had today we passed a few canoes today for the first time all week.

Camped on Newfoundland Lake

Sat July 18

Two Forest Rangers stopped in camp last night & got something to eat about 3 o'clock a.m. They had paddled since 10. P.M. To report a fire. Planes were flying around all morning. Fire was on Knife Lake. just a little ways off the course we took. we hoped we could be called up to help but were not. Came into canoe base about noon
